Motor	Textured Balls Offer baby a variety of balls in different sizes and textures. Show baby how to roll, toss, or push the balls around.	Ball Bounce Encourage baby to toss or bounce a ball into a large box or laundry basket.	Will It Fit? Use motor skills to test if a ball will fit in a tube. Provide balls of different sizes and tubes from toilet paper rolls and paper towels. Test each ball to see if it will fit.	Blow Bubbles Show baby how to blow bubbles through the wand. Next, you blow bubbles for baby to enjoy.	Bubble Wrap Crawl Place large sheets of bubble wrap on the floor. Show baby how to crawl on it and listen for the "pop."
Sensory & Science	Eating Balls Use the pincer grasp to pick up and eat Kix cereal (balls).	Ball Wash Fill a dishpan with water and a little soap. Provide balls in assorted colors, sizes and textures. Show baby how to wash the balls while describing the textures, sizes and colors.	Bubbles Put some bubble solution in a dishpan. Provide fly swatters, funnels, berry baskets, straws, bubble wands, etc. and show baby how to make bubbles.	Bubble Bottle Fill a clear plastic bottle about 2/3 full with water, food coloring, and dishwashing liquid. Super glue the lid on. Shake to make bubbles!	Bubble Wrap Painting Cut bubble wrap into small pieces and let baby dip on paint and then press on paper.

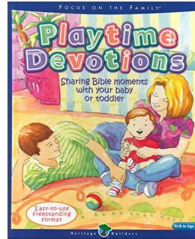
Infant Plans Notes
