Motor	<b>Nice Bunny Touches</b> Show baby how to pet a bunny using a stuffed rabbit. Encourage gentle and appropriate touches.	<b>Bunny's Tunnel</b> Encourage baby to crawl in and out of Bunny's Tunnel (a play tunnel).	<b>Bunny Hop</b> Use large motor skills to hop (jump) with or without help. Talk about how a bunny hops to move around.	<b>Bunny Tail Drop</b> Use fine motor skills to drop cotton balls (Bunny's tail) into an empty baby bottle.	<b>Gathering Veggies</b> Place real vegetables around the play area. Encourage baby to hop around and gather the carrots, celery and potatoes, like bunnies.
Sensory & Science	<b>Bunny's Home</b> Show baby a sensory tub filled with green Easter grass. Provide toy bunnies and oatmeal containers with the tops and bottoms removed. Show baby how to put Easter grass and bunnies in and out of tube bunny homes.	<b>Talking Time</b> Talk to baby about what you are doing. Use words to describe what Baby is doing. Name family members as they play with Baby. name toys and objects for Baby as Baby plays.	<b>Put The Tail On The Bunny</b> Provide a pre-cut shape of a rabbit. Let baby scribble on it with crayons, then show baby how to glue a pom pom or cotton ball where the bunny's tail goes.	<b>Bunny Tails</b> Put cotton balls and an ice cube tray in a dishpan. Show baby how to put the "bunny tails" (cotton balls) into the ice tray. Let baby explore the new texture.	<b>Washing Veggies</b> Show baby how to wash veggies with water and a vegetable brush. Wash the carrots, celery and potatoes.

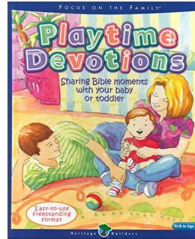
# Infant Plans Notes
