Motor	Groomer Provide stuffed dogs and cats with toy brushes, towels, etc. Show baby how to pretend wash and dry the pets, then brush them.	In The Doghouse Encourage baby to crawl in and out of a "doghouse" box. Provide bowls and blankets to pretend to eat, drink and sleep.	Hide the Cat Reinforce object permanence by hiding a stuffed cat under a blanket. Encourage baby to "find" it.	Yarn Ball Toss Use gross motor skills to toss yarn balls of different sizes. Try tossing them into a basket or bowl.	Going For A Walk Take stuffed cats and dogs on leashes for walks around the room or around the neighborhood.
Sensory & Science	Pet Collage Glue precut magazine pictures of dogs and cats onto poster board with baby. Talk about different types of dogs and cats.	Big & Small Explore stuffed dogs and cats. Discuss which ones are big and which ones are small.	Jingle Collars Show baby how to shake a cat collar with bells on it. Shake to a rhythm.	Crawl To... Encourage baby to choose between dog or cat. Place a stuffed dog on one side of the room and a stuffed cat on the other. Ask the baby to crawl to the one they want.	On the Grass Explore textures by crawling through some grass like a dog or cat would.

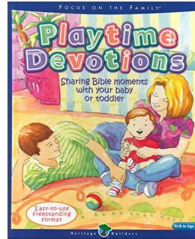
Infant Plans Notes
