<b>Motor</b>	<b>Crawl In, Crawl Out</b>  Crawl in and out of a tunnel to increase gross motor skills.	<b>Dinos In A Line</b>  Place toy dinosaurs in a line.	<b>Under The Tree Branches</b>  Work on gross motor skills by reaching and stretching for objects "under tree branches." This can be outside under trees, or inside pretending to reach under trees	<b>Where Is The Dinosaur?</b>  Search for and find hiding dinosaurs. The toy dinosaurs can be hidden behind something, under a blanket, or in plain sight.	<b>Can You Find The . . .</b>  Practice moving toward objects. Can you find the dinosaur?
<b>Sensory &amp; Science</b>	<b>Dino Dig</b>  Set up a sensory tub with sand or dry rice. Place the toy dinosaurs in the tub and have baby find them.	<b>Loud &amp; Soft Roar</b>  Explore sounds by roaring soft and roaring loud.	<b>Painting With Leaves</b>  Place paint in a paper plate. Show the infants how to dip a leaf in the paint and then dab or drage on paper.	<b>Playdough Prints</b>  Stomp the toy dinosaurs into the playdough to make paw and claw prints.	<b>Soft or Hard</b>  Provide objects to explore that are soft or hard. Talk about the texture of each.

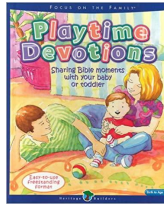
# Infant Plans Notes
