Sensory & Science	Wash and rinse plastic dishes in a dishpan filled with warm, soapy water. Provide sponges, bottle brushes, and wash cloths to introduce different textures.	Use nylon net puffs to print with blue and yellow paint on shelf paper. Hang up the artwork with clothespins.	Put strips of washi tape or painters tape on a flat surface. Show baby how to start peeling the tape off.	Put a twist on Tummy Time. Lay baby tummy-down on top of a soccer ball or kickball. Hold baby securely and move around in circles, forward and backward. Place toys close to baby and encourage reaching for them.	Dump a bag of frozen veggies into a large bowl. Let baby explore the cold food. Talk about the cold veggies.
