Show Baby photos of common objects in a house. Talk about these objects.

Dance and respond to music. Motor	Building A Neighborhood Build gross motor skills by building a neighborhood with blocks.	Clap, Wiggle, Cheer! Respond to familiar words by clapping, wiggling and cheering!	Mail Sorting Explore motor skills while moving paper. Show baby how to "sort" mail into two piles. Let baby do it their way!	Traffic Jam Use fine motor skills to roll objects. Put all of the toy cars and vehicles in a big pile. Encourage baby to move the cars out of the "traffic jam."	A Walk Through Our Neighborhood Use gross motor skills to practice walking through the neighborhood, either outside or make one inside with blocks and toys.
Sensory & Science	A Stroll In The Wagon Experience places using sight and sound while riding in a wagon (or stroller) around the yard or the neighborhood. Talk about what you see and hear.	Ice Play In an ice cube tray, fill with water and drops of food coloring. Freeze. Explore or paint with colored ice cubes on paper.	Sponge Fun Use hands to explore wet and dry textures. Provide sponges and a small bowl of water. Talk about what is wet and what is dry. Let baby explore!	Caring for Baby Doll Act in a caring way towards baby dolls. Provide small blankets, toy bottles, and other care items.	On the Grass Explore textures by crawling through some grass.
