Starfish Decorating Improve fine motor skills by decorating a starfish. Glue fruit puffs or Cheerios onto a starfish cut-out.	Develop fine motor skills while using seashells as a pointing tool. Dip shells into paint and press or smear onto paper.	Gone Fishing Practice fine motor skills by playing a dump and fill game with toy fish and a pail.
